### Virginia "Big Tree" Contest

4-H'ers, we need you to go hunting, not for animals, for trees! Do you



think you can find the "BIGGEST" tree in Washington County? You may enter up to three trees/one per species (Pine, Oak, Maple, Dogwood, etc.). Start looking for the largest tree you can find! Where could it be? An overall award will be given to the child who enters and properly identifies the largest circumference tree. Entries must have scientific and common names listed. Exact directions to location of tree required. You may not enter the same tree from the previous contests. Deadline to enter the county contest is November 17th. Winners will be

## **4-H Equine Science Programs**


