MINI-GARDEN PROJECT

What about the 4-H Mini-Garden project! Sign-ups will begin March 25th. This project offers members the opportunity to grow their very own garden at home. The size of the garden is 10 X 16 ft and 4-H provides the seeds, plants, and curriculum to make your garden. Participants ages 5-19 will be judged on their gardens and records. County winners receive cash awards in each age division. Awards are given to $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ place. This is a fun project and one of the most popular. Call the Extension office (676-6309) to register or for more information. Registrations will not be taken prior to March 25th. 25 gardens available.



It's the countywide poultry project! 4-H members will receive 15 (one day Old) vaccinated pullets free of charge. You will be required to keep records on your hens and show your best ones at the Washington County Fair in September. Participants will be required to submit project records for judging in October for the county contest.
